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The journal *Scope (Flexible Learning)* focuses on contemporary research in assessment of prior learning in, for, and about work, and professional practice. 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Formats include: editorials, articles, perspectives, essays, research notes, and work in progress. Other formats will also be considered. A short biography – less than 50 words – as well as title, details of institutional identity and affiliation (where relevant), and contact information (postal, email and telephone) should be provided on a cover sheet, with all such information withheld from the body of the submission. Low resolution images with full captions should be inserted into text to indicate their preferred position. High resolution images should be sent separately (see information for contributors) or check with the editors.

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
